collaboration and innovation in oncology**

What is JANE-2?

JANE-2 is a European initiative launched under **Europe's Beating Cancer Plan (EBCP)**. A Joint Action bringing together experts from across the continent to create **seven new Networks of Expertise (NoEs)** in oncology that will serve as the overarching framework to be integrated into healthcare systems at EU level. Alongside existing and emerging networks, the NoEs aim to transform the way cancer is addressed in Europe, setting new standards for collaboration, innovation, and equity in cancer-related services.

What are the Networks of Expertise?

Over the next four years, seven NoEs will be developed to support healthcare providers, professionals and researchers across Europe. Each network will focus on a key area where coordinated action is urgently needed:

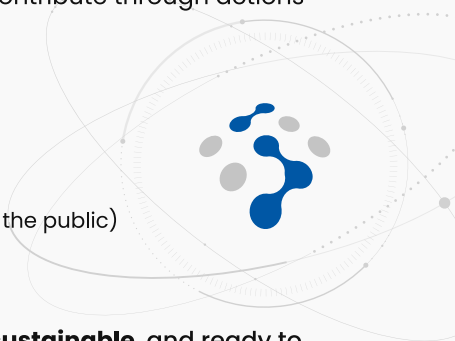

What will the NoEs do?

The NoEs will offer services and tools that strengthen cancer-related efforts across Europe—supporting professionals, researchers and institutions. While they will not deliver direct patient care, they will contribute through actions such as:

- Producing guidelines and recommendations
- Developing quality criteria
- Conceiving healthcare organizational models
- Promoting advocacy/policy/awareness
- Supporting education (of professionals, patients and the public)
- Promoting research
- Supporting patient engagement

By the end of JANE-2, the NoEs will be **inclusive, sustainable**, and ready to collaborate with other European oncology initiatives.



Who is involved?

JANE-2 is coordinated by **Fondazione IRCCS Istituto Nazionale dei Tumori**, Milan, Italy, and involves **133 organizations from 29 European countries**. The initiative is co-financed by the European Union with **EUR 40.5 million**.

Synergies

To enhance collaboration across Europe, JANE-2 has launched a restricted network hosted on the European Commission's Health Policy Platform, entitled **EU Health Networks: Synergies and Challenges**. This space brings together cancer-related Joint Actions, EU projects, and European Reference Networks (ERNs), including:
