

What are the Networks of Expertise?

Over the next four years, seven NoEs will be developed to support healthcare providers, professionals and researchers across Europe. Each network will focus on a key area where coordinated action is urgently needed:



NETWORK OF EXPERTISE ON CANCER COMPLEX AND POOR PROGNOSIS CANCERS Promote collaboration and innovation in areas such as pancreatic cancer and lung cancer



NETWORK OF EXPERTISE ON CANCER PALLIATIVE CARF Support the integration of evidence-based palliative care approaches across EU countries



NETWORK OF EXPERTISE ON CANCER SURVIVORSHIP Help ensure long-term support and equitable access for cancer survivors



NETWORK OF EXPERTISE ON CANCER PERSONALISED PRIMARY AND SECONDARY CANCER PREVENTION Advance tailored primary and secondary prevention strategies using genetic, lifestyle, and environmental data



NETWORK OF EXPERTISE ON CANCER OMICS TECHNOLOGIES Facilitate access to cutting-edge molecular biology for diagnosis and treatment



NETWORK OF EXPERTISE ON CANCER HI-TECH MEDICAL RESOURCES Ensure equal access to advanced technologies for diagnosis and treatment of cancer across Europe



NETWORK OF EXPERTISE ON CANCER ADOLESCENTS & YOUNG ADULTS WITH CANCER Bridge gaps between paediatric and adult oncology to improve survival for AYA patients

What will the NoEs do?

The NoEs will offer services and tools that strengthen cancer-related efforts across Europe—supporting professionals, researchers and institutions. While they will not deliver direct patient care, they will contribute through actions such as:

- Producing guidelines and recommendations
- · Developing quality criteria
- · Conceiving healthcare organizational models
- Promoting advocacy/policy/awareness
- Supporting education (of professionals, patients and the public)
- · Promoting research
- · Supporting patient engagement

By the end of JANE-2, the NoEs will be **inclusive**, **sustainable**, and ready to collaborate with other European oncology initiatives.

Who is involved?

JANE-2 is coordinated by **Fondazione IRCCS Istituto Nazionale dei Tumori,** Milan, Italy, and involves **133 organizations from 29 European countries**. The initiative is co-financed by the European Union with **EUR 40.5 million**.

Synergies

To enhance collaboration across Europe, JANE-2 has launched a restricted network hosted on the European Commission's Health Policy Platform, entitled **EU Health Networks: Synergies and Challenges**. This space brings together cancer-related Joint Actions, EU projects, and European Reference Networks (ERNs), including:

ECHOS, JARDIN, TEHDAS-2, CAN.HEAL, eCAN+, EUCanScreen, JA PreventNCD, CCI4EU, ERN-EURACAN, ERN-PaedCAN, ERN-EuroBloodNet, ERN-GENTURIS, EUnetCCC

The network aims to foster cooperation, knowledge exchange, and joint problem-solving, crucial in the development of new EU health networks.
